- To declare, students must have completed TWO (2) Geography courses with a C or better (2.0 GPA)
- Students must take 11 Upper Division Geography courses (minimum of 44 units) to complete the major
- All courses must be taken for a letter grade. Overall and major GPA of 2.0 is required to graduate
- By petition, one Independent Research class may apply: GEOG 199 (Independent Research) or GEOG 198A (Honors Research). Must be taken as a 4-unit, letter graded course

Physical Geography

- All Geography upper division courses (GEOG 100-up) count towards the major, with very few exceptions
- The STATISTICS requirement may be satisfied by the following: STATS 10, 12, 13, ECON 41, LIFE SCI 40, POLI SCI 6 or PUB AFF 60
